

Caster Removal & Replacement for Gasser Woodline Chairs

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TOOLS NEEDED:

1. Rawhide hammer or rubber mallet
2. Crowsfoot tack puller or large screwdriver



Step 1

Stabilize the chair upside down—use care and caution not to drag on any surface. This will create finishing and/or upholstery issues.



Step 2

Insert claw/screwdriver between metal caster collar and plastic socket.



Step 3

Using a firm, downward force on handle—caster will lift from socket.



Step 4

Remove caster and package for safekeeping—do not leave on floor—safety hazard.



Step 5

Visually inspect plastic socket in leg—we want a fully intact socket. If these are cracked or broken, they will need replaced, these can be removed and re-set with staples.



Step 6

Set caster in plastic socket. Firmly hit caster with rawhide hammer / or rubber mallet.
Note: Hit caster at same angle perpendicular to leg.



Step 7

Attach caster until seated. There will be some up and down movement of the caster in the socket—approximately 1/8" play. Caster is correctly seated when it can not be pulled out of the plastic socket. Use care when hitting caster—these can become a wedge and split the leg if you are overly aggressive.
